Re: West Bloomfield Township- Sanitary Sewer Main Relining

Dear Valued Customer;

We would like to take this opportunity to advise you that a sanitary sewer rehabilitation project is scheduled to commence in your area. The project involves lining sanitary sewers in the Evergreen Farmington Sewage Collection System with the intent of removing Infiltration and Inflow (I &I) from the collection system. This is significant because in the near future, the Township will be paying for every gallon of sewage that flows out of the system into the Detroit Sewer system. We are happy to tell you that we have been successful in obtaining project funding with low interest rate loans that are additionally offset with partial funding by Federal stimulus monies.

Liquiforce Services of Romulus, Michigan is the contractor that will be performing the work. You may see their trucks in your area. This is a very reputable Contractor with years of experience and expertise in relining sanitary sewer infrastructure. The activities that you can expect are: cleaning and televising of the sanitary sewers, grouting of joints if necessary, installation of the liner and reinstatement of sanitary house services at the connection point of the sewer main. Some of the activities of the Contractor, such as curing the liner in the sewer, may require that the contractor work later into the evening. Expect to be notified with a door hanger or by a representative of the Contractor when the liner is to be installed.

Installation of the liner and reinstatement of the laterals is a lengthy process resulting in extended hours. The Road Commission for Oakland County has limited hours to non-rush hours on primary roads such as Inkster, Middlebelt, Orchard Lake, Drake, 14 Mile, Maple, Walnut Lake, and Long Lake Roads. Work along these listed roads may occur during evening hours.

All activities by the Contractor are to be conducted in the public right-of-way or in easements of record. We would hope that there is very little area disturbed by this project as it is being performed by trenchless technology. All disturbed areas will be restored to their existing condition and are expected to be done very promptly, weather permitting.

We appreciate your cooperation as these necessary improvements and rehabilitation activities are being implemented throughout the Township to remove excess clear water flow from the sewage collection system. Our engineers for the project, Johnson & Anderson Inc, will have a representative on the site that will be able to answer any questions on how the project will affect your individual residence. They will be wearing identification badges and hard hats with a Johnson and Anderson logo.
